Application Process

by August 1 for Fall, by January 1 for Spring

1. Apply online for free via Lake Forest College Application or CommonApp
2. Submit all application materials: High School Transcript, College Transcript(s), Letter of Recommendation from a Professor
3. Chat with an Admissions Counselor
4. Transfer up to two years of college coursework (up to 64 semester hours)
5. Transcript Credit Evaluation can be provided at any state of the application process

- \$40,000 Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship
- Fine Arts Scholarship
- 100% of tuition covered via grants and scholarships through the Forester Flagship Program for qualified in-state students
- Up to \$52,000 in aid for international and undocumented students

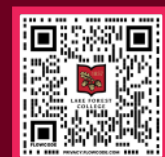
