Where Are We

Small town charm with a big city vibe, Quincy University (pop. 40,000) is located on the Mississippi River in close proximity to St. Louis (2 hours) and Chicago (5 hours). Our safe, inviting community will make you feel like you belong as soon as you arrive. Quincy is the regional hub for healthcare, business, retail, arts, and recreation, serving a population of more than 300,000 within a 50-mile radius.

How Much Does QU cost?

QU Graduation Rate

4-year graduation rate is 34% (2015-16)

6-year graduation rate is 50% (2015-16)

A Note about our Graduation Rate:

Our 4-year graduation rate is comparable to our regional competitors including McKendree (36%), Culver-Stockton (36%), and Western Illinois (30%). The 4-year graduation rate only tracks first-time, freshman students who begin their education at QU. If a student leaves for any reason, including transferring to another institution, that student is not included in the graduation rate. Students that transfer to QU also do not show up in our graduation rate.

Retention Rate

64% of first-time freshmen return to QU for their sophomore year (2016-17)

Enrollment & Demographics

- 1,124 students for the 2018-19 academic year
- Largest feed regions outside of the Quincy area include the St. Louis and Chicago metro areas
- Students of all faiths are welcome. Approximately 40% of QU students are Catholic.
- 23% minority students (2017-18)

- Student-Faculty ratio is 15:1
