


Private Illinois Colleges & Universities (PICU)

FAST FACTS

Columbia College Chicago will accept a maximum of 75 transfer credit hours from regionally accredited institutions. This includes AP/IB/CLEP and other postsecondary credit. There is no minimum number of credit hours required to transfer.

572 transfer students enrolled in Fall 2021. These students represented **36** states, Washington D.C. and **16** foreign countries.



APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS AND DEADLINES

Required items:

- Completed Columbia application—available at colum.edu/apply
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions
 where the student has enrolled
- Final High School or GED transcripts for students who:
 - Earned a GED or were homeschooled -or-
 - Attended a non-US high school -or-
 - Have earned fewer than 24 college credits at the time of application
- Some BFA and BMus programs require portfolio review/ audition and have earlier deadlines (see back)

November 15, 2022: Application deadline for Spring term

December 1, 2022: Application deadline for Acting, BFA and Musical Theatre Performance, BFA programs—Fall term start only

January 18, 2023: Application Deadline for remaining BFA and BMus programs—Fall term start only

January 18, 2023: Submission Deadline for Faculty Recognition Award—Fall term start only; requires completed application to the college

April 1, 2023: Priority Application Deadline for Fall term—BA and BS programs.

April 1, 2023: Application Deadline for Chicagoland Transfer Award—requires completed application to the college

TEST-FREE ADMISSIONS

Columbia College Chicago's admissions process is entirely test free. The standardized tests that many colleges have come to rely on have a deep history of bias. As a result, they have often served to exclude BIPOC and other underrepresented students from the professional opportunities and socioeconomic advancement afforded by higher education. Further, we know from years of reviewing applications and getting to know our students that these tests don't tell us anything important about a student's ability to succeed at Columbia.

COMBINED DEGREE PROGRAM

SCHOLARSHIPS

Columbia is proud to offer generous scholarship support to incoming transfer students. Merit, need, and talent-based scholarships are available.

MERIT-BASED AID

Dean's Scholarship: All applicants are automatically considered for this scholarship upon admission. See **colum.edu/deans** for more information.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship: All members of the PTK Honor Society are eligible for up to \$3,500 provided they meet the additional requirements at colum.edu/ptk.

Chicagoland Transfer Award: The Chicagoland Transfer Award was established to recognize transfer students from eligible Chicago-area community colleges. One full-tuition award and ten \$12,000 annual awards are available each year. A separate application is required. Find more details at **colum.edu/cta**.

NEED-BASED AID

Columbia Scholar Award: All applicants who complete the FAFSA, using Columbia's school code (001665), are automatically considered for this scholarship. Students who are not eligible to complete the FAFSA can contact **transfer@colum.edu** to learn about alternate options.

TALENT-BASED AID Fall applicants only

The Faculty Recognition Award: This is Columbia's talent-based scholarship. Portfolio/audition requirements and submission deadlines can vary based on intended major. See colum.edu/fra and colum.edu/bfa for more.
